**Grizzly Bear** 

This strong animal was once common all across the western United States, but now suffers from habitat loss due to logging, mining and land development. This habitat loss and threats to key food sources have also led to more conflicts with humans resulting in death.

By 2018 only a few of these animals remained in their southern territory in the Selkirk mountains. They were captured and moved north and are now integrated with the Columbia North subpopulation.

This shy animal suffered greatly from over-trapping and is still endangered by recreational use and overlogging in his environment.
