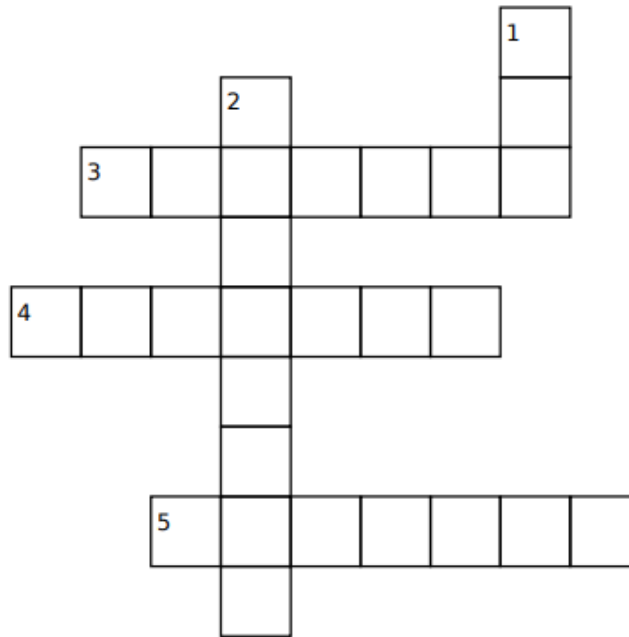

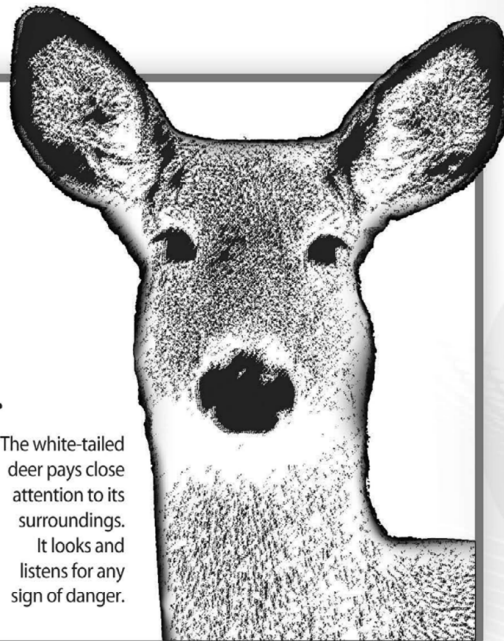
Attentiveness
