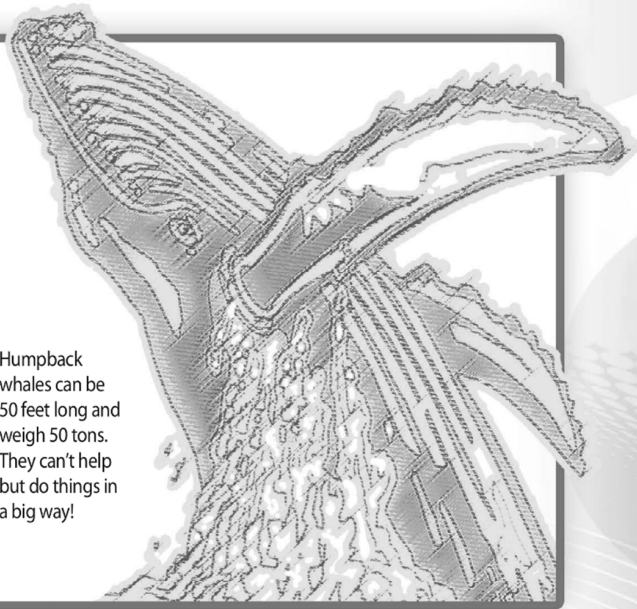
Enthusiasm
